Exodus 12:36-38 And the LORD gave the people favor in the sight of the Egyptians, so that they lent to them such things as they required. **And they spoiled the Egyptians.** And the children of Israel journeyed from Rameses to Succoth, about six hundred thousand on foot that were men, beside children. And **a mixed multitude** went up also with them; and flocks, and herds, even very much cattle.

Exodus 13:17-19 And it came to pass, when Pharaoh had let the people go, that God led them not through the way of the land of the Philistines, although that was near; for God said, Lest peradventure **the people repent when they see war**, and they return to Egypt: But God led **the people** about, through the way of the wilderness of the Red sea: and **the children of Israel** went up **harnessed out of the land of Egypt**. And Moses took the bones of Joseph with him: for he had straitly sworn the children of Israel, saying, God will surely visit you; and ye shall carry up my bones away hence with you.

Exodus 14:15-17 And the LORD said to Moses, Why cry you to me? speak to the children of Israel, that they **go forward**: But lift you up your rod, and **stretch out your hand** over the sea, and divide it: and the children of Israel shall **go on dry ground through the middle of the sea**. I, behold, I will ****harden the hearts of the Egyptians**, and they shall go in after them: and I will get myself honor over Pharaoh, and over all his armies, over his chariots, and over his horsemen.

Exodus 14:19-22 The angel of God, who went before the camp of Israel, moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud moved from before them, and stood behind them. It came between the camp of Egypt and the camp of Israel; and there was **the cloud and the darkness**, yet gave it **light by night**: and the one didn't come near the other all the night. Moses **stretched out his hand** over the sea, and the LORD caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all the night, and made the sea **dry land, and the waters were divided**. The children of Israel went into the midst of the sea **on the dry ground**, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand, and on their left.

Exodus 14:26-29 The LORD said to Moses, "**Stretch out your hand** over the sea, that the waters may come again on the Egyptians, on their chariots, and on their horsemen." And Moses **stretched forth his hand** over the sea, and the sea returned to his strength when the morning appeared; and the Egyptians fled against it; and the LORD overthrew the Egyptians in the middle of the sea. And the waters returned, and covered the chariots, and the horsemen, and all the host of Pharaoh that came into the sea after them; there remained not so much as one of them. But the children of Israel **walked on dry ground in the middle of the sea; and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand, and on their left**.

Exodus 15:1,2a Then sang Moses and the children of Israel this song unto the LORD, and spoke, saying, I will sing to the LORD, for he has triumphed gloriously: the horse and his rider has he thrown into the sea. *The LORD is my strength and song, and he is become my salvation:*

Revelation 15:3 And they sing the song of Moses the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, saying, Great and marvelous are your works, Lord God Almighty; just and true are your ways, you King of saints.

Leviticus 23:5-8 In the first month, on **the fourteenth day** of the month in the evening, is the **LORD's Passover**. On the fifteenth day of the same month is the feast of unleavened bread to the LORD. Seven days you shall eat unleavened bread. In **the first day** you shall have a holy convocation. You shall do no regular work. But you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD seven days. In **the seventh day** is a holy convocation: you shall do no regular work." You can have 4 Sabbaths in one week.

Exodus 12:34 The people took their dough before it was leavened, their kneading troughs being bound up in their clothes on their shoulders.

John 19:31 The Jews therefore, because it was the preparation, that the bodies should not remain upon the cross on the sabbath day, (for that sabbath day was an high day,) besought Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away.

NOTES:

Mark 3:1-6 He entered again into the synagogue, and there was a man there who had his hand withered. They watched him, whether **he would heal him on the Sabbath day**, that they might accuse him. He said to the man who had his hand withered, "Stand up." He said to them, "Is it lawful on the Sabbath day to do good, or to do harm? To save a life, or to kill?" But they were silent. When he had looked around at them with anger, being grieved at **the hardening of their hearts**, he said to the man, "**Stretch out your hand.**" He stretched it out, and his hand was restored as healthy as the other. The Pharisees went out, and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how they might destroy him.

Exodus 16:2,3 And the whole congregation of the children of Israel murmured against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness: And the children of Israel said to them, Would to God we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the flesh pots, and when we did eat bread to the full; for ye have brought us forth into this wilderness, to kill this whole assembly with hunger.

Exodus 16:25-29 Moses said, "Eat that today, for today is a Sabbath to the LORD. Today **you shall not find it in the field**. Six days you shall gather it, but on the seventh day is the Sabbath. In it there shall be none." It happened on the seventh day, that some of the people went out to gather, and they found none. The LORD said to Moses, "How long do you refuse to keep my commandments and my laws? Behold, because the LORD has given you the Sabbath, therefore he gives you on the sixth day the bread of two days. Everyone stay in his place. Let no one go out of his place on the seventh day."

Exodus 17:1b-3 ...and there was no water for the people to drink. Why the people did chide with Moses, and said, Give us water that we may drink. And Moses said to them, Why chide you with me? why do ye tempt the LORD? And the people thirsted there for water; and the people murmured against Moses, and said, Why is this that you have brought us up out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and our cattle with thirst?

Exodus 17:4-8 And Moses cried unto the LORD, saying, What shall I do to this people? they be almost ready to stone me. And the LORD said unto Moses, Go on before the people, and take with you of the elders of Israel; **and thy rod, with which you smote the river**, take in your hand, and go. Behold, I will stand before you there on the rock in Horeb; and you **shalt smite the rock**, and there shall come water out of it, that the people may drink. And Moses did so in the sight of the elders of Israel. And he called the name of the place Massah, and Meribah, because of the chiding of the children of Israel, and because they tempted the LORD, saying, **Is the LORD among us, or not?** Then came Amalek, and fought with Israel in Rephidim.

Exodus 17:15,16 And Moses built an altar, and called the name of it Jehovahnissi: For he said, Because the LORD has sworn that the LORD will have war with Amalek from generation to generation.

Month of Shevat

Deuteronomy 1:3 It happened in the fortieth year, **in the eleventh month, on the first day of the month**, that **Moses spoke to the children of Israel, according to all that the LORD had given him in commandment to them;**

Genesis 30:13 Leah said, “**Happy** am I, for the daughters will call me happy.” She named him Asher.

Genesis 49:20 “Asher’s food will be rich. He will yield royal dainties.

Deuteronomy 33:24-29 Of Asher he said, “Asher is **blessed** with children. Let him be acceptable to his brothers. Let him dip his foot **in oil**. Your bars shall be iron and brass. As your days, so your strength will be. “There is none like God, Jeshurun, who rides on the heavens for your help, In his excellency on the skies. The eternal God is your dwelling place. Underneath are the everlasting arms. He thrust out the enemy from before you, and said, ‘Destroy!’ Israel dwells in safety; the fountain of Jacob alone, in a land of grain and new wine. Yes, his heavens drop down dew. You are **happy**, Israel. Who is like you, a people saved by the LORD, the shield of your help, the sword of your excellency! Your enemies shall submit themselves to you. You shall tread on their high places.”

Proverbs 21:20 There is precious treasure and oil in the dwelling of the wise;

Proverbs 6:23 For the commandment is a lamp, and the Torah is light.

Matthew 25:1-4 “Then the Kingdom of Heaven will be like ten virgins, who took their lamps, and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. Those who were foolish, when they took their lamps, took no oil with them, but the wise took oil in their vessels with their lamps.

Tu B’Shevat or the 15th of Shevat is Wednesday!

Leviticus 19:23-25a And when you shall come into the land, and shall have planted all manner of trees for food, then ye shall count the fruit thereof as uncircumcised: **three years** shall it be as uncircumcised to you: it shall not be eaten of. But in **the fourth year** all the fruit thereof shall be holy to praise the LORD with. And in **the fifth year** shall ye eat of the fruit thereof.

Psalms 66:4 All the earth shall worship you, and shall sing unto you; they shall sing to your name. Selah.

Judges 5:1-3 Then sang Deborah and Barak the son of Abinoam on that day, saying, Praise ye the Lord for the avenging of Israel, when the people willingly offered themselves. Hear, O ye kings; give ear, O ye princes; I, [even] I, will sing unto the Lord; I will sing [praise] to the Lord God of Israel.

NOTES:

Luke 13:5-9 I tell you, no, but, unless you repent, you will all perish in the same way. "He spoke this parable. "A certain man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it, and found none. He said to the vine dresser, 'Behold, these three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and found none. Cut it down. Why does it waste the soil?' He answered, 'Lord, leave it alone this year also, until I dig around it, and fertilize it. If it bears fruit, fine; but if not, after that, you can cut it down.'"

Jeremiah 25:12,13 It shall happen, when seventy years are accomplished, that I will punish the king of Babylon, and that nation, says the LORD, for their iniquity, and the land of the Kasdim; and I will make it desolate forever. I will bring on that land all my words which I have pronounced against it, even all that is written in this book, which Jeremiah has prophesied against all the nations.

Daniel 9:1,2 In the first year of Darius the son of Ahasuerus, of the seed of the Medes, which was made king over the realm of the Chaldeans; In the first year of his reign I Daniel understood by books the number of the years, whereof the word of the Lord came to Jeremiah the prophet, that he would accomplish seventy years in the desolations of Jerusalem.

Haggai 1:1-4 In the second year of Darius the king, in the sixth month, in the first day of the month, the Word of the LORD came by Haggai, the prophet, to Zerubbabel, the son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and to Joshua, the son of Jehozadak, the high priest, saying, "This is what the LORD of Hosts says: These people say, 'The time hasn't yet come, the time for the LORD's house to be built.'" Then the Word of the LORD came by Haggai, the prophet, saying, "Is it a time for you yourselves to dwell in your paneled houses, while this house lies waste?"

Zechariah 1:7-10 On the twenty-fourth day of the eleventh month, which is the month Shevat, in the second year of Darius, the word of the LORD came to Zechariah the son of Berechiah, the son of Iddo, the prophet, saying, "I had a vision in the night, and behold, a man riding on a red horse, and he stood among the myrtle trees that were in a ravine; and behind him there were red, brown, and white horses. Then I asked, 'My lord, what are these?'" The angel who talked with me said to me, "I will show you what these are." The man who stood among the myrtle trees answered, "They are the ones the LORD has sent to go back and forth through the earth."

Zechariah 1:11,12 They reported to the angel of the LORD who stood among the myrtle trees, and said, "We have walked back and forth through the earth, and behold, all the earth is at rest and in peace." Then the angel of the LORD replied, "O LORD of Hosts, how long will you not have mercy on Jerusalem and on the cities of Judah, against which you have had indignation these seventy years?"

Zechariah 1:14-17 So the angel who talked with me said to me, "Proclaim, saying, 'Thus says the LORD of Hosts: "I am jealous for Jerusalem and for Zion with a great jealousy. I am very angry with the nations that are at ease; for I was but

a little displeased, but they added to the calamity.” Therefore thus says the LORD: “I have returned to Jerusalem with mercy. **My house shall be built in it,**” says the LORD of Hosts, **“and a line shall be stretched forth over Jerusalem.”** “Proclaim further, saying, ‘Thus says the LORD of Hosts: “My cities will again overflow with prosperity, and the LORD will again comfort Zion, and will again choose Jerusalem.”’”

Zechariah 1:18,19 I lifted up my eyes, and saw, and behold, four horns. I asked the angel who talked with me, “What are these?” He answered me, “These are the horns which have scattered Judah, Israel, and Jerusalem.”

Zechariah 1:21 The LORD showed me four craftsmen. Then I asked, “What are these coming to do?” He said, “These are the horns which scattered Judah, so that no man lifted up his head; but these have come to terrify them, to cast down the horns of the nations, which lifted up their horn against the land of Judah to scatter it.

Zechariah 2:1-5 I lifted up my eyes, and saw, and behold, a man with a measuring line in his hand. Then I asked, “Where are you going?” He said to me, **“To measure Jerusalem, to see what is its breadth and what is its length.”** Behold, *the angel who talked with me went forth, and another angel went out to meet him,* and said to him, “Run, speak to **this young man,** saying, ‘Jerusalem will be inhabited as villages **without walls,** because of the multitude of men and livestock in it. For I,’ says the LORD, **‘will be to her a wall of fire around it,** and I will be the glory in the midst of her.
