Deuteronomy 29:10-15 You stand today, all of you, before the LORD your God; your captains of your tribes, your elders, and your officers, all the men of Israel, your little ones, your wives, and your **stranger** that is in your camp, from the cutter of your wood to the drawer of your water; so that **you should enter into covenant** with the LORD your God, and into His oath, which the LORD your God makes you today; that He may establish you today for a people to Himself, and that He may be a God to you, as He has said to you, and as He has sworn to your fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob. Nor do I make this covenant and this oath with you only, but with him who stands here with us today before the LORD our God, **and also with him that is not here with us today.**

Zephaniah 3:8,9 “Therefore wait for Me,” says the Lord, “Until the day I rise up for plunder; My determination is to gather the nations To My assembly of kingdoms,
To pour on them My indignation, All My fierce anger; All the earth shall be devoured with the fire of My jealousy. “For **then I will restore to the peoples a pure language**, That they all may call on the name of the Lord, To serve Him with one accord.

Nehemiah 8:1,2 And all the people gathered themselves together as one man into the street that was before the water gate; and they spake unto Ezra the scribe to bring the book of the law of Moses, which the Lord had commanded to Israel. Nehemiah 8:5,6 And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people; (for he was above all the people;) and when he opened it, all the people stood up: And Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God. And all the people answered, Amen, Amen, with lifting up their hands: and they bowed their heads, and worshipped the Lord with their faces to the ground.

Deuteronomy 29:14,15 Neither with you only do I make this covenant and this oath; But with him that standeth here with us this day before the Lord our God, and also with him that is not here with us this day:

Deuteronomy 29:24-28 Even all nations shall say, Wherefore hath the LORD done thus unto this land? what meaneth the heat of this great anger? Then men shall say, Because they have forsaken the covenant of the LORD God of their fathers, which he made with them when he brought them forth out of the land of Egypt: For they went and served other gods, and worshipped them, gods whom they knew not, and whom he had not given unto them: And the anger of the LORD was kindled against this land, to bring upon it all the curses that are written in this book: And the LORD rooted them out of their land in anger, and in wrath, and in great indignation, and **cast them** into another land, as it is this day.

Deuteronomy 29:29 The secret things belong unto the LORD our God: but those things which are revealed belong **unto us and to our children for ever**, that we may do all the words of this law.

Deuteronomy 30:1 And it shall be when all these things have come on you, the blessing and the curse which I have set before you, and when you shall call **שׁוּב** them to mind **לָבֹב** among all the nations where the LORD your God has driven you,

Deuteronomy 30:2 and shall return **שׁוּב** to the LORD your God and shall obey His voice according to all that I command you today, you and your sons, with all your heart, and with all your soul,

Deuteronomy 30:3-6 then the LORD your God will **turn שׁוּב** your captivity. And He will have compassion on you, and **will return שׁוּב** and gather you from all the nations where the LORD your God has scattered you. If you are driven out into the outermost parts of the heavens, the LORD your God will gather you from there, and He will bring you from there. **And the LORD your God will bring you into the land which your fathers possessed, and you shall possess it.** And He will do you good, and multiply you above your fathers. And the LORD your God will circumcise **your heart and the heart** of your seed, to love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul, so that you may live.

Isaiah 61:1,2 The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me; because the Lord hath anointed me to preach good tidings unto the meek; he hath sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to them that are bound; To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance of our God;

NOTES:

Isaiah 61:4,5 And they shall build the old wastes, they shall raise up the former desolations, and they shall repair the waste cities, the desolations of many generations. And strangers shall stand and feed your flocks, and the sons of the alien shall be your plowmen and your vinedressers.

Isaiah 61:8,9 For I the Lord love judgment, I hate robbery for burnt offering; and I will direct their work in truth, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them. And their seed shall be known among the Gentiles, and their offspring among the people: all that see them shall acknowledge them, that they are the seed which the Lord hath blessed.

Isaiah 62:10-12 Go through, Go through the gates! Prepare the way for the people; Build up, Build up the highway! Take out the stones, Lift up a banner for the peoples! Indeed the LORD has proclaimed to the end of the world: "Say to the daughter of Zion, 'Surely your **salvation**(Yeshua) **is coming**; **Behold, His reward is with Him, And His work before Him.**" And they shall call them The Holy People, The Redeemed of the LORD; And you shall be called Sought Out, A City Not Forsaken.

Revelation 22:12 And, behold, I come quickly; and my reward is with me, to give every man according as his work shall be. I am the Aleph and the Tav, the beginning and the end, the first and the last.

Isaiah 63:1-5 Who is this that cometh from Edom, with dyed garments from Bozrah? This that is glorious in his apparel, travelling in the greatness of his strength? I that speak in righteousness, mighty to save. Wherefore art thou red in thine apparel, and thy garments like him that treadeth in the winefat? I have trodden the winepress alone; and of the people there was none with me: for I will tread them in mine anger, and trample them in my fury; and their blood shall be sprinkled upon my garments, and I will stain all my raiment. For the day of vengeance is in mine heart, and the year of my redeemed is come.

Psalms 47:1-3 O clap your hands, all ye people; shout unto God with the voice of triumph. For the Lord most high is terrible; he is a great King over all the earth. He subdues nations under us, and peoples under our feet.

Psalms 47:5-8 God has gone up with a shout, the Lord with the sound of a trumpet. Sing praises to God, sing praises! Sing praises to our King, sing praises! For God is the King of all the earth; sing praises with a psalm! God reigns over the nations; God sits on his holy throne.

Exodus 19:16 And it came to pass on the third day in the morning, that there were **thunders** קולות and lightnings, and a **thick cloud** upon the mount, and the voice קול of the shofar exceeding loud; so that all the people that was in the camp trembled.

Revelation 1:10 I was in the Spirit on the Lord's day, and heard behind me a **great voice, as of a trumpet.**

Revelation 14:2 And I heard a voice from heaven, as the voice of many waters, and as the **voice of a great thunder.**

NOTES:

Revelation 16:17,18 And the seventh angel poured out his vial into the air; and there came a great voice out of the temple of heaven, from the throne, saying, It is done. And there were **voices, and thunders, and lightnings; and there was a great earthquake**, such as was not since men were upon the earth, **so mighty an earthquake, and so great.**

Exodus 19:17,18 And Moses brought forth the people out of the camp to meet with God; and they stood at the nether part of the mount. And mount Sinai was altogether on a smoke, because the Lord descended **upon it in fire**: and the smoke thereof ascended as the smoke of a furnace, **and the whole mount quaked greatly.**

Revelations 4:1-5 After these things I saw, and behold, **a door opened** in heaven, and the first voice that I heard, a **voice as of a trumpet** speaking with me, one saying, Come up hither, and I will show thee the things which must come to pass hereafter. Straightway I was in the Spirit: and behold, there was **a throne set in heaven, and one sitting upon the throne**; and he that sat was to look upon like a jasper stone and a sardius: and there **was a rainbow round about the throne**, like an emerald to look upon. And round about **the throne** were **four and twenty thrones**: **and upon the thrones** I saw four and twenty elders sitting, arrayed in white garments; and on their heads crowns of gold. And **out of the throne** proceed **lightnings and voices and thunders**. And there was seven lamps of **fire burning before the throne**, which are the seven Spirits of God.

Revelation 4:9-11 And when those beasts give glory and honour and thanks to him that sat on **the throne**, who liveth for ever and ever, The four and twenty elders fall down before him that sat on **the throne**, and worship him that liveth for ever and ever, and **cast their crowns before the throne**, saying, Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for **thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created.**

Revelation 5:1-5 And I saw in the right hand of him that sat **on the throne** a book written within and on the backside, sealed with seven seals. And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice, Who is worthy **to open the book**, and to loose the seals thereof? And no man in heaven, nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to **open the book**, neither to look thereon. And **I wept much**, because no man was found worthy **to open and to read the book**, neither to look thereon. And one of the elders saith unto me, **Weep not**: behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, hath prevailed to **open the book**, and to loose the seven seals thereof.

Revelation 5:8-10 And when he had taken the book, the four beasts and four and twenty elders fell down before the Lamb, having every one of them harps, and golden vials full of odours, which are the prayers of saints. And they sung a new song, saying, Thou art worthy to take the book, and **to open the seals** thereof: for thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation; And hast made us unto our God **kings and priests**: and we shall reign on the earth.

Exodus 19:5 Now therefore, if you will indeed **obey my voice and keep my covenant**, you shall be my treasured possession among all peoples, for all the earth is mine; and you shall be to me **a kingdom of priests** and a holy nation.

2Kings 18:1 Now it came to pass in the third year of Hoshea son of Elah king of Israel, **that Hezekiah the son of Ahaz** king of Judah began to reign.

2Chronicles 29:1-3 **Hezekiah** began to reign when he was five and twenty years old, and he reigned nine and twenty years in Jerusalem. And his **mother's name was Abijah, the daughter of Zechariah**. And he did that which was right in the sight of the Lord, according to all that David his father had done. He in the first year of his reign, in the first month, opened the doors of the house of the Lord, and repaired them.

2Chronicles 30:1-3 And **Hezekiah** sent to all Israel and Judah, and wrote letters also to Ephraim and Manasseh, that they should come to the house of the Lord at Jerusalem, to keep the Passover unto the Lord God of Israel. For the king had taken counsel, and his princes, and all the congregation in Jerusalem, to keep the Passover in the second month. For they could not keep it at that time, because the priests had not sanctified themselves sufficiently, neither had the people gathered themselves together to Jerusalem.

2Chronicles 30:10-12 So the posts passed from city to city through the country of Ephraim and Manasseh even unto Zebulun: but they laughed them to scorn, and mocked them. Nevertheless divers of Asher and Manasseh and of Zebulun humbled themselves, and came to Jerusalem. Also in Judah the hand of God was to give them one heart to do

the commandment of the king and of the princes, by the word of the Lord.

2Kings 18:4,5 He removed the high places, and brake the images, and cut down the groves, and brake in pieces the brasen serpent that Moses had made: for unto those days the children of Israel did burn incense to it: and he called it **Nehushtan**.

Hosea 1:2 When the Lord began to speak by Hosea, the Lord said to Hosea: “Go, take yourself a wife of harlotry And children of harlotry, For the land has committed great harlotry by departing from the Lord.”

Hosea 8:11,12 Because Ephraim has made many altars for sin, They have become for him altars for sinning. I have written for him **the great things of My law**, but they were considered **a strange thing**.

Hosea 10:12 Sow for yourselves righteousness; Reap in mercy; Break up your fallow ground, For **it is time to seek the Lord**, Till He comes and rains righteousness on you.

Hosea 14:8,9 “Ephraim shall say, ‘What have I to do anymore with idols?’ I have heard and observed him. I am like a green cypress tree; Your fruit is found in Me.” Who is wise? Let him understand these things. Who is prudent? Let him know them. For the ways of the Lord are right; The righteous walk in them, But transgressors stumble in them.

2Kings 18:13 Now in the **fourteenth year** of king Hezekiah did Sennacherib king of Assyria come up against all the fenced cities of Judah, and took them.

2Kings 18:14-16 And Hezekiah king of Judah sent to the king of Assyria to Lachish, saying, I have offended; return from me: that which thou put on me will I bear. And the king of Assyria appointed unto Hezekiah king of Judah three hundred talents of silver and thirty talents of gold. And Hezekiah gave him all the silver that was found in the house of the Lord, and in the treasures of the king's house. At that time did Hezekiah cut off the gold from the doors of the temple of the Lord, and from the pillars which Hezekiah king of Judah had overlaid, and gave it to the king of Assyria.

2Chronicles 32:1-3 After these things, and the establishment thereof, Sennacherib king of Assyria came, and entered into Judah, and encamped against the fenced cities, and thought to win them for himself. And when Hezekiah saw that Sennacherib was come, and that he was purposed to fight against Jerusalem, He took counsel with his princes and his mighty men to stop the waters of the fountains which were without the city: and they did help him.

2Chronicles 32:6-8 And he set captains of war over the people, and gathered them together to him in the street of the gate of the city, and spake comfortably to them, saying, Be strong and courageous, be not afraid nor dismayed for the king of Assyria, nor for all the multitude that is with him: for there be more with us than with him: With him is an arm

of flesh; but with us is the Lord our God to help us, and to fight our battles. And the people rested themselves upon the words of Hezekiah king of Judah.

2Chronicles 32:9-11 After this did Sennacherib king of Assyria send his servants to Jerusalem, (but he himself laid siege against Lachish, and all his power with him,) unto Hezekiah king of Judah, and unto all Judah that were at Jerusalem, saying, Thus saith Sennacherib king of Assyria, Whereon do ye trust, that ye abide in the siege in Jerusalem? Doth not Hezekiah persuade you to give over yourselves to die by famine and by thirst, saying, The Lord our God shall deliver us out of the hand of the king of Assyria?

2Chronicles 32:18-20 Then they cried with a loud voice in the Jews' speech unto the people of Jerusalem that were on the wall, to frighten them, and to trouble them; that they might take the city. And they spake against the God of Jerusalem, as against the gods of the people of the earth, which were the work of the hands of man. And for this cause Hezekiah the king, and the prophet Isaiah the son of Amoz, prayed and cried to heaven.

2Kings 18:19 And Rabshakeh said unto them, Speak ye now to Hezekiah, Thus saith the great king, the king of Assyria, What confidence is this wherein thou trustest?

2Kings 18:23-25 Now therefore, I pray thee, give pledges to my lord the king of Assyria, and I will deliver thee two thousand horses, if thou be able on thy part to set riders upon them. How then wilt thou turn away the face of one captain of the least of my master's servants, and put thy trust on Egypt for chariots and for horsemen? Am I now come up without the Lord against this place to destroy it? The Lord said to me, Go up against this land, and destroy it.

2Kings 18:26 Then said Eliakim the son of Hilkiah, and Shebna, and Joah, unto Rabshakeh, Speak, I pray thee, to thy servants in the Syrian language; for we understand it: and talk not with us in the Jews' language in the ears of the people that are on the wall.

2Kings 18:29-31 Then Rabshakeh stood and cried with a loud voice in the Jews' language, and spake, saying, Hear the word of the great king, the king of Assyria: Thus saith the king, Let not Hezekiah deceive you: for he shall not be able to deliver you out of his hand: Neither let Hezekiah make you trust in the Lord, saying, The Lord will surely deliver us, and this city shall not be delivered into the hand of the king of Assyria. Harken not to Hezekiah: for thus saith the king of Assyria, Make an agreement with me by a present, and come out to me, and then eat ye every man of his own vine, and every one of his fig tree, and drink ye every one the waters of his cistern:

Micah 4:2B-4 For out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between many peoples, and shall decide disputes for strong nations far away; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore;

but they shall sit every man under his vine and under his fig tree, and no one shall make them afraid, for the mouth of the Lord of hosts has spoken.

2Kings 19:6,7 So the servants of king Hezekiah came to Isaiah. And Isaiah said unto them, Thus shall ye say to your master, Thus saith the Lord, Be not afraid of the words which thou hast heard, with which the servants of the king of Assyria have blasphemed me. Behold, I will send a blast upon him, and he shall hear a rumour, and shall return to his own land; and I will cause him to fall by the sword in his own land.

2Kings 19:35,36 And it came to pass that night, that the angel of the Lord went out, and smote in the camp of the Assyrians an hundred fourscore and five thousand; and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they were all dead corpses. So Sennacherib king of Assyria departed, and went and returned, and dwelt at Nineveh.

2Kings 20:1 In those days was Hezekiah sick unto death. And the prophet Isaiah the son of Amoz came to him, and said unto him, Thus saith the Lord, Set thine house in order; for thou shalt die, and not live.

Exodus 12:22,23 And ye shall take a bunch of hyssop, and dip it in the blood that is in the bason, and strike the lintel and the two side posts with the blood that is in the bason; and none of you shall go out at the door of his house until the morning. For the Lord will pass through to smite the Egyptians; and when he seeth the blood upon the lintel, and on the two side posts, the Lord will pass over the door, and will not suffer the destroyer to come in unto your houses to smite you.

2Kings 20:5,6 Turn again, and tell Hezekiah the captain of my people, Thus saith the Lord, the God of David thy father, I have heard thy prayer, I have seen thy tears: behold, I will heal thee: on the third day thou shalt go up unto the house of the Lord. And I will add unto thy days fifteen years; and I will deliver thee and this city out of the hand of the king of Assyria; and I will defend this city for mine own sake, and for my servant David's sake.

2Kings 20:8,9 And **Hezekiah** said unto Isaiah, What shall be the sign that the Lord will heal me, and that I shall go up into the house of the Lord the third day? And Isaiah said, This sign shalt thou have of the Lord, that the Lord will do the thing that he hath spoken: shall the shadow go forward ten degrees, or go back ten degrees?

2Chronicles 32:23,24 And many brought gifts unto the Lord to Jerusalem, and presents to Hezekiah king of Judah: so that he was magnified in the sight of all nations from thenceforth. *In those days Hezekiah was sick to the death, and prayed unto the Lord: and he spake unto him, and he gave him a sign. But Hezekiah rendered not again according to the benefit done unto him; for his heart was lifted up:* therefore there was wrath upon him, and upon Judah and Jerusalem.

NOTES:

2Chronicles 32:27-29 Hezekiah had **very great riches and honor**. And he made himself treasuries for silver, for gold, for precious stones, for spices, for shields, and for all kinds of desirable items; **storehouses for the harvest** of grain, wine, and oil; and stalls for all kinds of livestock, and folds for flocks. Moreover he provided cities for himself, and possessions of flocks and herds in abundance; for God had given him very much property.

Isaiah 39:1-3 At that time Merodachbaladan, the son of Baladan, king of Babylon, sent letters and a present to **Hezekiah**: for he had heard that he had been sick, and was recovered. And Hezekiah was glad of them, and shewed them the house of his precious things, the silver, and the gold, and the spices, and the precious ointment, and all the house of his armour, and all that was found in his treasures: there was nothing in his house, nor in all his dominion, that Hezekiah shewed them not.

2Chronicles 32:31 Howbeit in the business of the ambassadors of the princes of Babylon, who sent unto him **to enquire of the wonder that was done** in the land, **God left him, to try him, that he might know all that was in his heart.**

Isaiah 39:5-8 Then said Isaiah to **Hezekiah**, Hear the word of the LORD of hosts: Behold, the days come, that all that is in thine house, and that which thy fathers have laid up in store until this day, shall be carried to Babylon: nothing shall be left, saith the LORD. And of thy sons that shall issue from thee, **which thou shalt beget**, shall they take away; and they shall be eunuchs in the palace of the king of Babylon. Then said Hezekiah to Isaiah, Good is the word of the LORD which thou hast spoken. He said moreover, For there shall be peace and truth in my days.

2Chronicles 33:1 Manasseh was **twelve years old** when he began to reign, and he reigned fifty and five years in Jerusalem:
